Hints and tips for a smoother journey

To a new driver, the EV charging world can be an unfamiliar place. Our tips and guidance help you on your way.



How do you charge your e:Ny1?

Some charging points have a built-in cable. Many have no cable, so you need to carry your own charging cable with you in your car.

- + Most EV drivers plug into a charging point whenever they park. They like to stay topped up.
- + The way that you pay for your battery charge depends on the location. At some places you can start just by plugging in. At others you may need an app, a contactless card, or an RFID card.



A 60-mile top-up in just 11 minutes

DC rapid charging gives you a 60-mile top up in just 11 minutes. Plug the Type 2 CCS charging cable into the matching socket that comes as standard with the e:Ny1.

Raising your battery charge level from 10% to 80% at a rapid charger takes about 45 minutes.



Paying for your battery charge

Network providers charge for electricity in different ways:

- + Some ask for a flat rate every time you top up.
- + Others offer discounts to drivers who pay a monthly membership fee.
- + Check how each supplier expects you to pay before you travel.

To simplify things, the Government says that all newly installed rapid or higher-powered electric car charging points should be fitted with contactless bank-card readers.
