Grants for home charging points

A Government grant could knock £350 off the cost of installing a charging station at your home.

+ Grants make home-charging easier

An OVEZ grant could cut the cost of installing a home charging station. The grant covers £350 or 75% of the cost of buying and installing a home charger, whichever is lower.

The grant gets its name from the Office for Zero Emission Vehicles (OVEZ), a Government team supporting the transition to zero-emission vehicles. The grant's official name is the Electric Vehicle Chargepoint Grant.

You may qualify for a grant if you:

- + Live in (a) a flat that you own or (b) a rented flat or house.
- + Have dedicated off-street parking.
- + Own, lease, or have use of an eligible electric or plug-in hybrid vehicle.
- Have not previously claimed this grant or its predecessor.*

Other restrictions and grant-winning opportunities:

- + You can claim only one OVEZ grant for each eligible vehicle or household.
- Your landlord or property manager may be able to claim an additional grant to help build the infrastructure that you and your neighbours need. This grant provides up to £500 per residential parking bay (max 60 bays).
- + There are also grants to help businesses install EV infrastructure for staff and fleet parking.

Do you need permission?

Before you install a home charger, you may need permission from your freeholder, managing agent, neighbours, or local planning authority.

+ ULEZ scrappage grants

Although there are no grants specifically for the e:Nyl, anyone who lives in London within the ULEZ boundary may qualify for a scrappage grant. If your current car doesn't meet the ULEZ standard – and you match the grant's eligibility criteria – you may be able to claim up to £2,000 for scrapping your car.

Even bigger grants are available for wheelchair-accessible vehicles: a payment of £10,000 to scrap your current car or £6,000 to retrofit it to the ULEZ standards.
